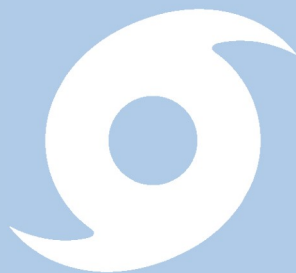
## Hurricane Season

Hurricane season has officially started.

It helps to be prepared so as boater you should be proactive and plan for severe weather before it becomes a problem. Now is the time to get ready for the hurricane season which typically, runs from June through November.

Luckily, we don't have any storms on the radar right now. The threat right now is low but it is never too early to prepare.

We advise that you check all your dock lines and replace them if they are worn and make sure all your fenders are in a good position. It is not a bad idea to double up your lines and use backup lines wherever you can. Large tarps can create a hazard in high winds so keep the tarps to a minimum. Check your bilge pumps for functionality and be prepared. Stay safe !



## PARKING

When you come to visit the harbor please do not park in Kewalo Basin Park area and tow away/loading zones or the sidewalk.

Also, encourage your customers to use public transportation such as The Bus, Biki Bike, Uber, Lyft
