Check out our new recycling station next to the harbor master office! You can recycle, aluminum cans, plastic bottles, used lines, fishing lines, and fishing weights. Any proceeds recycling will towards purchasing Seabins for the harbor. What is a Sea Bin? The Seabin is an innovative new form of removing plastic, oils and other detritus from our seas and oceans. Essentially a floating rubbish bin, the Seabin is designed to be deployed in marinas and other ports, coastal areas to capture the waste.

Rule of the month

Please make sure to dispose of waste properly. You can find dumpsters and trash receptacles all over property. Please take advantage of the oil dump that is conveniently located right next to the harbor masters office for any type of oily waste like filters, rags, or used oil cans and of course used oil. Please do not abandon bulky items like engines, generators, couches or old dingys next to the dumpster. For bulky trash or hazardous trash other than oil please visit https://www.honolulu.gov/opala for proper disposal options.

§15-212-111 Littering or polluting land areas prohibited.

- (a) No person shall throw, place, leave, deposit or abandon, or cause or permit to be thrown, placed, left, deposited or abandoned any litter, except in receptacles designated by the HCDA for the disposal of such materials. "Litter" as used in this section includes any and all types of debris and substances, whether liquid or solid, and materials such as garbage, refuse, rubbish, glass, cans, bottles, paper, wrappings, fish or animal carcasses or any other substances which render harbor lands or facilities unsightly, noxious or otherwise unwholesome to the detriment of the public health and welfare and effective and safe operation of the harbor.
- (b) No person shall deposit oil, oily refuse, sludge, chemicals or other hydrocarbons on state property except in specially designated collection points. These items may not be left in or near standard refuse containers or anywhere else on harbors property. Penalties, including but not limited to the revocation of mooring permits and the right to use the facilities, may be invoked.
