Rule of the month

§15-212-48 Revocation of revocable permit. If the permittee fails to remedy any breach of any of the duties, covenants, or conditions of the permit or to desist from violating of these rules, the HCDA may revoke the permittee's revocable permit, or, at its discretion, refuse to renew the permittee's revocable permit. A revocable permit may be terminated or revoked for the following reasons, although termination and revocation are not necessarily limited to these reasons:

- (1) Failing to report to the HCDA within seven days:
- (A) A change in ownership of the vessel;
- (B) A change in address of the permittee;
- (3) Failing to renew a mooring permit
- (5) Failing to satisfactorily meet delinquent outstanding indebtedness
- (11) Failing to submit a monthly report showing gross receipts to the HCDA within thirty days after the last day of the month being reported together with net charges due;
- (12) Failing to ensure that the vessel named in the mooring permit is properly documented, certificated, or registered with the appropriate federal or state agencies concerned; or
- (13) Failing to maintain insurance coverage as required in section 15-212-41.

Unless the time limit to remedy the breach is otherwise specified in these rules or in a notice given to the permittee, the permittee shall have thirty days to remedy the breach.

Stormwater BMP Tip



Store sewage in holding tanks and dispose of properly at a pump-out station or use a pump-out service. Even treated sewage is a threat to the shallow water environments. You can find our pumpout station at the fueldock next to the harbor masters office. It's free to use for harbor tenants, so please utelize it!
